In collaboration with the Special Exhibition, 'The Destruction and Rebirth of Exported Old-Imari - The Tragedy of Loosdorf Castle'

The Okura Tokyo, opened in September 2019 by the Hotel Okura Tokyo Co., Ltd. Special Exhibition, 'The Destruction and Rebirth of Exported Old-Imari - The Tragedy of Loosdorf Castle'

[Period of exhibition : Tuesday 3rd November 2020 (Holiday) to Sunday 24th January 2021] *Closed every Monday (When Monday is a holiday, the following day) and over the year-end and New Year season (28th December to 1st January)

A collection of porcelain, mainly Old Imari, held by Loosdorf Castle outside Vienna, Austria. Almost all of the collection was damaged when the castle was taken over by the former Soviet army at the end of World War II. After the war all the fragments were stored and put on view in the castle, and now some 150 pieces including some partially restored items are being exhibited overseas for the first time.
